

LETTER OF NOTIFICATION

Date: March , 2011

Re: Proposed Invasive and Aquatic Nuisance Species Control – Seven Hills Lake

The Seven Hills Lake Association is planning to continue Invasive and Aquatic Nuisance Species Control in 2011. Control will focus on aquatic herbicide and algicide application to control excessive growth of invasive species, Curlyleaf Pondweed (*Potamogeton crispus*) and Eurasian watermilfoil (*Myriophyllum spicatum*) as well as nuisance algae. The program is being carried out by NYSDEC certified personnel with ALLIED BIOLOGICAL INC., a licensed and registered lake management firm with NYSDEC (# 01301). NYSDEC Aquatic Pesticide Permit applications have been submitted to NYSDEC requesting approval for the application of the herbicide Aquathol-K and the algicide Captain.

Treatment is anticipated to occur between April 1 and August 31, 2011 and will proceed only after the Seven Hills lake Association obtains permits from NYSDEC authorizing treatments. Notification of treatment dates will be provided to the Association 7 days prior to treatment. Water use restrictions will be posted around the lake on the day of treatment.
